

Pension Application for Isaac Amsden

Brattleboro within said county, April 10th Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and eighteen—

Be it Remembered that on the day of the date of these presents—came personally before me Gilbert Denison one of the Assistant Judges of said Windham County Court Isaac Amsden of Brattleboro in said county and made the following declaration under oath by me administered to him in pursuance of the act of the Congress of the United States entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war” passed March 1818—

And it appearing to me the said Judge to my satisfaction that the said Isaac Amsden served in the Revolutionary War agreeably to the provisions of said act I do hereby certify and transmit to the Honorable the Secretary of the department of war the following Testimony in the case—and proceedings had thereon under my official signature and the seal of said county court. Gilbert Denison, Asst Judge of the County Court.

I Isaac Amsden of Brattleboro in the county of Windham and State of Vermont do testify and say—That I served in the War of the Revolution for more than the term of nine months as a private soldier on the Continental establishment—That is to declare and say—that I enlisted the last of April 1775 as a private soldier in Capt Granger’s Company, Col. Larnards Rigement [Regiment] & according to my best recollection Gen. Reeds Brigade. That I joined the army at Roxbury Massachusetts on a term of eight months but before the expiration of my first term I enlisted into the years service under Capt Haynes Col Whitcombs Reg and after the evacuation of Boston in 1776 I left that place & went to Ticonderoga and was honorably discharged about the last of December 1776—

And I do further testify, declare and say, that from my reduced circumstances I need the assistance of my country for support. (Signed) Isaac Amsden
