

**Pension Application for Daniel Bartlett**

W.15570 (Widow: Deborah) Married February 3, 1785. He died March 12 1843.

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of an act of congress of the seventh of June 1832.

State of Massachusetts

County of Hampshire SS.

On this eighth day of August 1832 personally appeared in open Court before Samuel Hinkley Esqr, Judge of the Court of Probate now sitting for s'd County of Hampshire Daniel Bartlett a resident of Hadley in the County of Hampshire and state of Massachusetts aged seventy seven years, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832.

That he enlisted into the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated.

Viz. On the twentieth day of April 1775 he marched from said Hadley in the Company of Militia of Elakim Smith of said Hadley was Captain to Cambridge in the State of Massachusetts having previously enlisted as a minute man. The first Lieutenant of s'd company was Moses Kellogg of s'd Hadley and the Lieutenant was Elihu Lyman of Northfield in the state of Massachusetts. After he arrived at Cambridge he enlisted for the term of eight months in the above mentioned company commanded by the same officers. The company belonged to a regiment commanded by Col. Jonathan Ward of Skenesborg in the s'd state. The name of the two majors belonging to s'd regiment were Major Benes & Major Wheelip, the given names he does not recollect. He continued at Cambridge in the above service till sometime in July following and then went to Dorchester in the same company and regiment and continued there to serve part of the time of his enlistment till the first of January following when he was permitted to return to Hadley.

That in the year 1777 on the 22d day of Setpember of s'd year he marched [?] s'd Hadley as a volunteer in the Company commanded by Capt. Moses Kellogg of s'd Hadley—John Clark of s'd Hadley was the Lieutenant of s'd company. The company had but one Lieutenant of s'd company. He [?] s'd comaoy joined the army at Stillwater in the State of New York. The regimen to which the company belonged was commanded by Col. Elisha Porter of s'd Hadley. He believes there was no other field officer connected with s'd regiment. He continued in s'd company and regiment till the surrender of Burgoyne when he was dismissed and returned home.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.
