

### **Pension Application for Herman Minclear**

Declaratin in order to obtain the benefit of the act of congress passed the 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832.

State of New York

Ulster County SS.

On the Eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two personally appeared in open Court before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for Ulster County being a Court of Record for said County, proceeding according to the course of Common Law, with a Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount and keeping a record of their proceedings, having a Clerk and Seal of their own. Herman Minclear a resident of the Town of Kingston in the County of Ulster aged seventy five years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed the 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated.

That he was Born in the town of Kingston in the County in the Year 1757. That the record of his age was in Father's family Bible. That he lived at the time he was called into service—that he has lived since the Revolutionary war and that he now lives in the said town of Kingston—

That he volunteered in the Service of the Militia of the State of New York as a private Soldier on or about the first of April 1777 in the company under the command of Capt Frederick Schoonmaker in Colonel John Snyder's Regiment for Four months and was stationed with said company at Fort Montgomery and continued there is sais service untill about the first of August following when he with the said company was discharged. (But received no written discharge.)

And this applicant further declares that he again volunteered in [blank] 1778 in said service as aforesaid in the Company of Capt Philip Smart for Three Months and was Stationed at Warwarsing and in Shandaken as a gaurd [guard] to the Frontiers and continued in said Service the full term of Three Months and then discharged (received no written discharge).

And he further declares that [blank] (1778) he again volunteered the same as aforesaid in the Company of Capt. Jeremiah Snyder, Lieutenant Hommel for Two Months and was stationed in the Town of Saugerties at the house of Tobias Wynkoop as a frontier gaurd, and continued in said service the full term of two months and was then discharged (no written discharge).

Finally he further declares that through and infinity he may not be exactly right as to dates. But he declares positively that he has served as a private Soldier in the Revolutionary War for the full term of Nine Months in campaigns as above stated.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any agency in any state. (Signed with his mark) Harman Minclear
