

**Pension Application for Henry T. Osterhoudt**

W. 26601 (Mariah Dewitt.) Married April 3, 1830. Henry died October 24, 1842.

Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832.

On this thirteenth day of September in the year 1832 personally appeared in open court, before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Ulster aforesaid, now sitting, Henry T. Osterhoudt a resident of the town of Wawarsing in said County, aged sixty seven years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

That he was born in the town of Rochester, Ulster County in the year 1765. That he has a record of his age in his Bible. That he lived in Rochester when called into service, and has lived since and lives now in the town of Wawarsing.

That he entered as a Volunteer into the militia service of the State of New York in the company under the command of Capt John L. Hardenburgh in Colonel Wysenbelt's Regiment and was stationed in the Town of Wawarsing at the house of John L. Hardenburgh and continued to live in said Corps as a guard [guard] to the Frontiers—for the full term of Nine Months—and that he never received a written discharge—said service commenced about the first of April 1781—and was discharged in the winter following (1782) and for the proff [proof] he refers

To the annexed certificates and affidavits.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever, to a Pension or Annuity, except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any Agency in any State. (Signed) Henry T. Oosterhoudt.
