

**Pension Application for Samuel Russell**

On this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the court of common pleas in and for the said county of Suffolk, personally appears Samuel Russel In the sixty third year of his age, resident in the Township of Southampton on Long Island in the county and state aforesaid, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress, entitled "and Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war"

That he the said Samuel Russel enlisted in Quoque vicinity In said Township in the month of March In the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six, in the company commanded by Captain John Davis of the Town of Easthampton on Long Island aforesaid, in the regiment commanded by Colonel Livingston, and that he served as a common soldier in the revolutionary war, against the common enemy for the term of twelve months at the end of said term of time he was discharged from service in the state of New York aforesaid at a place called Fishkill, he further saith, that his discharge was in writing but after the most diligent search, it cannot be found, (which he much regrets)—

Further the deponent saith that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said serviced. (Signed) Samuel Russell
