Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of June 7, 1832.

On this Eighth day of September 1827, personally appeared in open court before Daniel Gleason, Cyrus D. Sheldon & Henry V.W. Martin, Justices of the Troy Justices Court now sitting, Isaac Snedekor a resident of Troy in the county of Rensselaer, and State of New York, aged seventy seven years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

In the month of June 1777, at Beekman in the County of Dutchess, he joined the company commanded by Israel Vail, in Colonel James Vanderburgh's Regiment. Lieutenant Colonel Benjamin Birdsall & Major William Clark was stationed at Fishkill until the last of October in the same year when he was discharged—In 1778 he again joined the same company in the spring of the year and served six months – and in the year 1779 & 1780 was out in the same company at least six months in each year— was stationed at Fishkill, was often at Verplank's Point. Fort Washington, and West Point and distinctly recollected that the two last years he was out, one Bailey was the adjutant of the Regiment.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State. (Signed) Isaac Snedekor
