

Pension Application for Joshua Tucker

On this fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me Daniel C. Verplanck one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in & for Dutchess County personally appeared Joshua Tucker seventy two years old resident in the State of New York, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war.

That he the said Joshua Tucker at the commencement of said war entered in a company commanded by Capt James Rosecrans in Col. Dubois regiment in the six month service in the New York line of the Revolutionary army, that after faithfully serving said time of enlistment he enlisted in said company for the space of twelve months and that had expired he [?] enlisted in the same regiment for the term of three years, that after he had faithfully served the same but [?] of his enlistement he again enlisted in Capt Dubois Company in a Regiment commanded by Col VanCortlandt during the war [but he moved in his Regiment?] during the war of the Revolution that he was in the battle of Fort Montgomery at the Battle of York Town at the Capture of Cornwallis and that he was regularly discharged from the said service that his discharge is not in his power to produce but that the same is lost that he is in reduced circumstances and that he is [in] need of assistance from his country for support & that he never had a pension from the United States.
